

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# Ist Stop!



This is a public park located in the Katong area of Singapore, near the East Coast Parkway. It is a popular recreational area among locals, offering a peaceful respite from the bustling city.

The park is named after the nearby Katong neighbourhood, and is home to a variety of trees and plants, including mature heritage trees. You can take a stroll along the park's walking trails, or relax on its benches and enjoy the scenic views of the sea. The park also features a playground for children and a fitness corner for adults.

In addition, the park has a rich history, as it was once the site of a World War II fortification known as Fort Tanjong Katong. The fort was built by the British in 1879 to defend the eastern coast of Singapore against potential attacks. Today, you can still see remnants of the fort, such as the gun emplacements and ammunition bunkers, which have been preserved as part of the park's heritage.





#### 2nd Stop

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A seawater reverse osmosis desalination plant located in the Marina East area of Singapore, it is one of four desalination plants in Singapore, and was commissioned in 2020. The plant has a capacity of producing 30 million gallons of drinking water per day, and is capable of supplying water to up to 200,000 households.

The plant uses advanced technology to convert seawater into clean drinking water, including a pre-treatment system to remove impurities and a reverse osmosis process to remove salt and other minerals. The Marina East Desalination Plant plays a crucial role in Singapore's water supply strategy, as the country relies heavily on imported water from neighbouring countries.

The plant helps to diversify Singapore's water sources and reduce its dependence on external water supplies, ensuring water security for the nation.





#### 3rd Stop





Marina Barrage was completed in 2008 and serves multiple functions, including flood control, water storage, and recreation. The barrage is a unique engineering feat, designed to prevent flooding in low-lying areas of the city during high tides. At the same time, it also creates a freshwater reservoir, which can be used for various purposes, such as irrigation, drinking water, and industrial use.

One of the most popular features of Marina Barrage is its rooftop garden, which offers panoramic views of the city skyline. The garden is also a popular spot for picnics, kiteflying, and other outdoor activities. In addition, the barrage has a visitor centre, showcasing the various functions and features of the facility, including its sustainable design and water management systems.

## MARINA BAY SKY PARK






THE Shoppes@ MBS


#### From Breakwater@Marina East, Cycle back to the dam@Marina Barrage

#### Continue on Rhu Cross until you reach a junction




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#### Turn right at junction to Tg Rhu Rd




































#### Turn left at Katong Park Junction
